BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN Homeland Security and Emergency Management

Mercer University's **Bachelor of Science in Homeland Security and Emergency Management** prepares students to answer the call of threats to public safety with a focus on the management aspect of this field, such as organizing and pre-planning for manmade and natural disasters. The program's interactive approach gives students a deeper understanding of disaster and emergency preparation through policy and procedure design and implementation. Students will study new approaches to combat cybercrime, experience how components of the public safety system interact, and design and develop policies for responding to threats.

FULLY ONLINE PROGRAM

The B.S. in Homeland Security and Emergency Management is offered in a fully online format. Courses are structured in eight-week sessions, and students will have the same access to faculty and campus resources as students taking courses in a traditional classroom setting. Students can comfortably take two classes per week while maintaining a work-life balance.

Candidates must have a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.25 (on a 4.0 scale). The program admits students five times per year in January, March, May, August, and October.
